Tone 8 Troparion (St Sergius)
 From your youth you received Christ into your soul, O ven'erable one, and above all desired to leave behind the turmoil of the world. You courageously settled in the wilderness, where you raised children in obedience, the fruits of humility. Thus, as an abode of the Trinity, you enlightened all who approached in faith and granted healing to all.//

Now as you stand before the throne of the Trinity, entreat God's help and grace for them and for all Orthodox Christians, so that we may sing: "Rejoice, divinely-wise Sergius!"
