Tone 7 Troparion (Resurrection)

By Your Cross You destroyed death. To the thief You opened Paradise. For the Myrrhbearers You changed weeping into joy. And You commanded Your disciples, O Christ God, to proclaim that You are risen,// granting the world great mercy.

Tone 4 Troparion (for the Martyrs)

O God of our Fathers, always act with kindness towards us; take not Your mercy from us, but guide our lives in peace// through the prayers of Venerable Isaac, Dalmatus, and Faustus!

Tone 7 Kontakion (Resurrection)

The dominion of death can no longer hold mankind captive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers. Hell is bound, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to those in faith;// enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection!"

Tone 2 Kontakion (for the Martyrs)

Through asceticism you shone like lights in the world, and by your faith you overthrew heresies. We praise you with hymns, Isaac, Dalmatus, and Faustus,// as servants of Christ, who are praying for us all.

Tone 7 Prokeimenon

The Lord shall give strength to His people. The Lord shall bless His people with peace. (Ps 28/29:11)

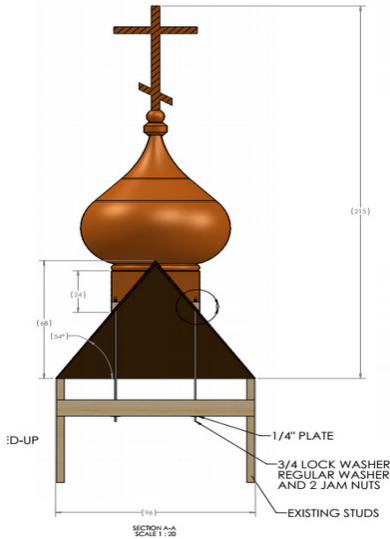
