## Tone 5 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, born for our salvation from the Virgin; for He willed to be lifted up on the Cross in the flesh, to endure death, and to raise the dead// by His glorious Resurrection.

## Tone 4 Troparion (*St John the Baptist*)

Your head was revealed to us by Christ as a divine treasure in the earth, O Prophet and Forerunner. We gather in honor of this discovery with inspired hymns of praise to the Savior,// Who saves us from corruption through your prayers.

## Tone 6 Kontakion (*St John the Baptist*)

The shining pillar on earth, the Forerunner, lamp of the Spiritual Sun, has revealed his radiant, holy head to the ends of the earth. He sanctifies those who venerate it and who faithfully cry:// “Wise Baptist of Christ, save us all!”

## Tone 4 Kontakion (*from the Pentecostarion*)

I come to You, O Christ, blind from birth in my spiritual eyes, and call to You in repentance:// “You are the most radiant Light of those in darkness.”

## Tone 8 Prokeimenon (*Resurrection*)

Pray and make your vows before the Lord, our God! (Ps 75/76:11)

*v: In Judah God is known; His name is great in Israel. (Ps 75/76:1)*

## Tone 7 Prokeimenon

The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord, and shall hope in Him. (Ps 63/64:11)

## Epistle Acts 16:16-34

2 Corinthians 4:6-15 (*Forerunner*)

Tone 8 Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!
